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GENERAL CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1

MEMBERSHIP

The Gospel Ministerial Alliance is a non-profit corporation, chartered under the State Laws of Texas without capital stock or shares being issued. The connection with the corporation shall be in the form of membership only. Any funds accruing above operating expenses shall be used in the spreading of the Gospel Message to the world.

In the event of the dissolution of the corporation, any assets of the corporation remaining after all indebtedness has been paid, will be distributed to those churches that have been affiliated with the corporation or other worthy religious institutions.

The membership, both ministers and churches, of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance, believing that Civil Government is ordained of God, pledge our allegiance to the government of the United States of America. We believe that Christians should obey the laws of our Civil Government in all things in so far as it does not violate our constitutional rights in the free worship of God.

Headquarters office is located at 2844 Menard Hwy. Brady, Texas.

ARTICLE 2

MINISTERS AFFILIATION

1. The membership rolls are open to God called and anointed ministers of the Gospel who are able to qualify under the standards of requirements.

2. Anyone desiring to affiliate with the Gospel Ministerial Alliance shall file an application for Membership with the Membership

Committee and having been signed by one members of the Alliance who are in good standing in the Alliance.

3. Applicant must fill in all answers on the Application for Membership. The committee on membership shall pass on the application and if endorsed, shall present it to the proper official for final disposition.

SECTION ONE--QUALIFICATIONS--MINISTERS

1. Those desiring membership with the Gospel Ministerial Alliance must have a definite call of God into the Charles Page 4
06/04/03ministry and be an Ordained Minister.

2. Any minister who fails to conduct himself in a manner becoming a minister of the Gospel or fails to abide by the Articles of Faith and the Constitution and by-laws of the Alliance. He/She shall be dropped from the rolls of the Alliance ministers at the end of the current year the violation occurs.

SECTION TWO--MINISTERS DUES

1. Membership dues are set annually by the Presiding Bishop.
2. Year of membership is to appear prominently on all credentials and certificates.
3. Dues are to be sent with renewal application each year. No credentials are to be mailed until dues are paid.
4. Dues entitle members to Credentials Certificate, and by request a copy of the General Constitution and by-laws.
5. A portion of a year shall be paid for as a year.
6. Failure to pay dues by October 31st is considered evidence that the member is withdrawing from membership in the Alliance and it shall so be accepted as such. The defaulting member is considered freed from all allegiance or obligation in regard to the Alliance.

SECTION THREE--MINISTERS REQUIREMENTS

1. Any minister of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance should at all times remember the instructions in the Bible concerning their ministry,

life, conduct, doctrine and their position before the Church and the world. 2 Corinthians 3:6, 6:3-10; 1 Timothy 4:6; Romans 12:6-8; Acts 6:4.

2. It is recommended that ministers shall be in full time ministry. It is acceptable to work outside the Ministry provided the Ministry is their first and prominent profession.

ARTICLE THREE

CHURCHES AFFILIATION

The Gospel Ministerial Alliance being a chartered corporation of Gospel Ministers and affiliated Gospel Churches, considers that:

SECTION ONE--CLASSIFICATION

The churches of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance shall be of two classifications and shall operate under the authority, direction and leadership of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance. The two classifications of the churches are:

- a. Those churches that are established by the Gospel Ministerial Alliance.
- b. Those churches that are in existence and voluntarily unite with the Gospel Ministerial Alliance.

SECTION TWO--CHURCHES UNDER CLASSIFICATION A

The churches that are established by the Gospel Ministerial Alliance shall be under the authority and leadership of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance in its entirety. Direction and operation of the Church and its requirements and qualifications are set forth in an article written by the Gospel Ministerial Alliance and is entitled, "THE CHURCH".

SECTION THREE--CHURCHES THAT ARE UNDER CLASSIFICATION B

The churches that have been previously established and voluntarily uniting with the Gospel Ministerial Alliance shall meet the qualifications and requirements of churches as stated in an article entitled "THE CHURCH" written by the Gospel Ministerial Alliance. Any existing differences shall be resolved to meet the qualifications and requirements of a Church and of the Articles of Faith and the General Constitution and By-Laws of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance. The Gospel Ministerial Alliance has made provisions in an article entitled "AN AGREEMENT" whereby existing churches may unite with the Alliance and be identified with the churches of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance.

SECTION FOUR--MEMBERSHIP DUES

Each Church of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance and those churches that voluntarily unite with the Alliance shall be issued a Church Certificate annually. The fee for each year shall be set annually by The Presiding Bishop and the certificate shall show that said Church is in accord with the principles of the Gospel Ministerial Alliance.

1. Current dates are to appear in a prominent manner on all Certificates.
2. Dues are to be sent with renewal applications each year. No Credentials are to be issued until dues are paid.
3. A portion of a year shall be paid for as a year.
4. All Churches that reside in the United States and its territories must apply for and report to the Gospel Ministerial Alliance their Employer Identification Number as issued by the US Internal Revenue Service.
5. Any Church that has voluntarily united with the Gospel Ministerial Alliance and fails to renew the Church Certificate annually shall be considered as withdrawing from the Alliance and shall forfeit all claims to its benefits and privileges as a member Church of the Alliance.

6. Any Church that has so voluntarily united with the Alliance and fails to abide by the Articles of Faith and the Constitution and By-Laws of the Alliance, shall be dropped from the rolls of the churches at the end of the current year in which such violation shall occur.

ARTICLE 4

GENERAL CONFERENCE

SECTION ONE--MEETINGS

A general session of the Alliance shall be held as often as deemed necessary by the Presiding Bishop or as need may require. All members of the Alliance are urged to be in attendance if possible. Such meeting to be called the General Conference.

SECTION TWO--DATE AND PLACE OF MEETING

The General Conference shall be held at such time and place as may be determined by the Presiding Bishop.

ARTICLE 5

GENERAL OFFICERS

SECTION ONE--NAMES OF OFFICERS

The alliance shall have the following general officers:

1. Presiding Bishop
2. Senior Elder
3. District Elders
4. Secretary
5. Treasurer

SECTION TWO--THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board shall consist of the general officers of the Alliance. The Executive Board shall consist of the Presiding Bishop, Senior Elder, District Elders and the Secretary and Treasurer.

SECTION THREE--FINAL AUTHORITY

The Executive Board shall be the highest court of appeal in all matters both material and spiritual and the final authority on any question.

SECTION FOUR--VACANCIES AND ADDITIONS

The Presiding Bishop shall fill vacancies or additions to any general office as such need arises.

SECTION FIVE--QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS

In order to hold a general office in the Alliance the following requirements are to be met:

1. A general officer must be at least 25 years of age.
2. He/She must be a minister in good standing with the Alliance.
3. He/She must be a minister that has been proven in his calling by faithful, consecutive performance of his duties as a minister in the field.

ARTICLE 6

DUTIES OF GENERAL OFFICERS

SECTION ONE--EXECUTIVE BOARD

1. The duties of the Executive Board shall be to direct the activities and business of the Alliance both spiritual and material.
2. To attend to all business matters of the Alliance.
3. To assist in the sectional or district meetings or business when needed.

4. To make amendments to the General Constitution and By-Laws when necessary.
5. To appoint District Elders in new districts.
6. The Presiding Bishop, Senior Elder and two District Elders shall act as Credential Committee.

SECTION TWO--PRESIDING BISHOP

1. The Presiding Bishop shall preside at all General Conferences and at all Executive Board meetings.
2. To call Executive Board meetings.
3. Appoint all committees pertaining to the general work of the Alliance.
4. To sign every Credential and Church Certificate.
5. To act as manager of the Alliance and to oversee all general work.
6. To attend all annual conferences both general and district.
7. The Presiding Bishop shall act as president of the Alliance in all official and legal matters.
8. He/She shall sign all official and legal documents, deeds or mortgages or other legal papers.
9. The corporation shall act as trustee of all Alliance property.

SECTION THREE--SENIOR ELDER

1. He/She shall attend all district conferences. The Senior Elders is to be a member of the Bishop's Cabinet.
2. He/She shall attend all Executive Board meetings.

3. He/She shall represent the Alliance in all work and shall be amenable to the Executive Board.

4. He/She shall promote and further the work of the Alliance in all districts and maintain a spirit of harmony and cooperation between the ministers.

5. To assist, when called upon by the District Elder, pastor, or a Church without a pastor, in dealing with local Church problems.

6. To act as Presiding Bishop when and if the Presiding Bishop is ill or otherwise incapacitated.

7. He/She shall be empowered to ordain ministers when called upon.

SECTION FOUR--DISTRICT ELDERS

1. He/She shall attend all district conferences. District Elders are to be advisors of the Bishop's Cabinet.

2. He/She shall attend all Executive Board meetings when such session has business in his district or section.

3. He/She shall represent the Alliance in all district work and shall be amenable to the Executive Board.

4. He/She shall promote and further the work of the Alliance in his district and maintain a spirit of harmony and cooperation between the ministers in his district.

5. To assist, when called upon by the pastor, or a Church without a pastor, in dealing with local Church problems.

6. To preside as chairman of district conferences.

7. To appoint a district board to help in administration of the business of that district. Such board members to be called District Presbyters and to be three (3) in number, and must be ordained ministers in good standing in the Alliance.

8. He/She must be consulted in regard to establishing of new churches in his district.

9. He/She shall be empowered to ordain ministers of his district in the district meetings or when called upon in General Conference.

ARTICLE 7

COMMITTEES

SECTION ONE--EXECUTIVE BOARD

All committees of the Executive Board are to be appointed by the Presiding Bishop and for such duration as indicated.

SECTION TWO--CREDENTIAL COMMITTEE

1. The Credential Committee shall be composed of the Presiding Bishop, Senior Elder the Elder of the District from which the application comes and one other District Elder who shall be appointed by the Presiding Bishop.

2. Duties of the Credential Committee.

a. To examine all applications for membership and if approved the District Elders shall sign the accepted application.

b. Applicants shall be considered on those requirements and qualifications set forth in the General Constitution and By-laws of the Alliance--Article 2, Section One, Section Three of the General Constitution and By-Laws of the Alliance.

ARTICLE 8

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS

SECTION ONE--AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

Amendments to by-laws may be made by the Executive Board when necessary, providing:

1. The Executive Board must accept such amendment.
2. After ratification by the Executive Board the Amendment must be accepted by seventy-five percent (75%) of the General Conference.
3. Each and every amendment must be considered separately.
4. Such amendment must be passed by the Executive Board at least sixty days (60) before the next General Conference.

ARTICLE 9

DISTRICTS

SECTION ONE--NEW DISTRICTS

1. Any group of ministers desiring to form a new district may apply to the Presiding Bishop or any member of the Executive Board who shall refer the application to the Executive Board.
2. Should an agreement be reached to form a new district, written notices must be mailed to all members in the area for a call meeting that shall be presided over by the Presiding Bishop.
3. All new districts must be in conformity to and in harmony with the General Constitution and By-Laws of the Alliance.

SECTION TWO--NEW TERRITORIES

1. The Presiding Bishop may appoint a representative of the new territory until such time said territory might be formed into a district.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

FOREWORD

The purpose of the New Testament Church is to reflect the Glory, Power and Wisdom of the Lord Jesus Christ to all mankind. 1 Peter 2:9.

In order that this purpose may be perpetuated and carried out in a manner in keeping with the testimony of the Christians the believers in Christ Jesus, in our day, Philippians 2:15, we unite to form the

GOSPEL MINISTERIAL ALLIANCE

This Fellowship is a united cooperative body of Gospel Ministers and Churches, who realize that in unity there is strength. That through our combined efforts, we can, in a better manner, minister the unsearchable riches of Christ Jesus to the fallen race of Adam so they may become the born again Sons of God.

Our purpose is to exalt the Eternal God and Savior Jesus Christ. Titus 2:13. He who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity and purify us, a people zealous of good works. Titus 2:14.

It is with this desire in our hearts that we turn our combined efforts to:

Proclaim the Gospel Truths. Luke 24:46-48; Ephesians 1:7, 2:12-22.

Promote Fellowship among Christians who have obtained like precious faith. 2 Peter 1:1.

Ordain and send out ministers of the Gospel of the Kingdom of God. Matthew 4:23-24, 9:35; Luke 4:18-19, that men everywhere may hear the good news of Salvation through the blood of the New Testament. 1 Corinthians 11:25.

Establish churches that believers may assemble together to worship God and be fed by God anointed ministers. Hebrews 10:25; 1 Peter 5:2-3; Acts 20:28.

Send out missionaries that all men may hear the Gospel of Salvation. Mark 16.

Provide the necessary educational facilities to properly educate, teach and train God's people in understanding the Bible and it's truths. 2 Timothy 2:15.

To these fundamental principles and their accomplishment we dedicate our all to Jesus Christ, as vessels through which the power of God may flow to the fulfillment of His will.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

ARTICLE 1

GOD

God is self-existing, invisible, eternal, a Spirit, infinite in power, Holy in Nature, attributes and purpose and is therefore free from all limitations. Exodus 3:14-15; Hebrews 11:27; 1 Timothy 1:17; 1 John 5:20; John 4:24; Genesis 17:1; 1 Timothy 6:16.

SECTION ONE--THE FATHER

The one true God became the Father by His acts of Creation. Genesis 1:1, 1:31, 2:1-4, 5:1-2; John 1:1-5. The First Commandment to men was, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is one Lord". Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29.

SECTION TWO--THE SON

The Eternal invisible, Self-existing One, manifested Himself in the flesh as the only begotten of the Father, the Son of God. Isaiah 9:6; John 1:14. Virgin born. Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:20-25. The Lamb of God. John 1:29; 1 Peter 1:19-20; 1 Timothy 3:16; 2 Corinthians 5:19. The Saviour. 1 John 4:9. His name is Jesus. Matthew 1:21; Acts 4:12.

ARTICLE 2

THE BIBLE

We believe that the word of God to man, is the message contained in the book known as the Holy Bible. We believe that the Bible is a translation from the original languages (Hebrew, Greek, Aramaic) into the English language. It is the final authority on all matters for

the Christian and is their guide in following Jesus Christ, our Lord. We by default use the King James version of the Bible, but not exclusively.

SECTION ONE--THE WORD OF GOD

Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of the Lord. Matthew 4:4. The words that Jesus spoke and recorded in the Holy Bible are words of life and Spirit to those that believe. John 6:63. The world and all that is in it was made by the word of God. Hebrews 11:3. The word of God, the Bible, was written by men who were moved upon by the Spirit of God. 1 Thessalonians 2:13. God has spoken to man in times past by the prophets but in these last days has spoken to us by His Son. Hebrews 1:1-2. These words of Jesus were recorded by men who were inspired by the Holy Spirit in the Holy Bible and are for our admonition. 1 Corinthians 10:11. The Bible records the words of Jesus that we might believe and believing be converted. John 20:31.

SECTION TWO--CREATION AND FALL OF MAN

By the word of God, the Bible, we find that God created man in His image, pure and perfect. By the deceitfulness of sin man fell from that condition and death entered into man. Genesis 1:26-27, 2:7, 3:17-19; 1 Corinthians 15:21-22; Ephesians 2:1-4; Romans 5:12.

SECTION THREE--A SAVIOR PROMISED

The word of God, the Bible, promised, a Savior-redeemer to the fallen race of men, who will redeem him and bring him back to God. Genesis 3:15, 22:4-14, 22:15-18; John 1:29; Acts 2:36; Deuteronomy 18:15-19; Acts 3:22-23.

ARTICLE 3

SAVIOR-REDEEMER

The Savior-Redeemer, Jesus Christ, our near-kinsman Redeemer, Ruth 4:9-12, took on Him the form of man, the seed of Abraham,

Hebrews 2:16, so that by one offering he should bring redemption through His blood to all men. Hebrews 10:14, 12:19-24.

SECTION ONE--VIRGIN BIRTH

We believe that Jesus Christ was born by immaculate conception of the virgin Mary. Matthew 1:20-25; Isaiah 7:14; John 3:16.

SECTION TWO--THE NAME

We believe that the name of the Saviour-Redeemer is JESUS. Matthew 1:21-25. That repentance and remission of sins shall be preached in the name JESUS. Luke 24:45-48; Acts 2:38, 10:43. That all power in Heaven and in earth is in the name JESUS. Matthew 28:18; Acts 4:12.

SECTION THREE--THE LAMB OF GOD

The Bible teaches that Jesus Christ is the perfect, sinless, sacrificial lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. Genesis 22:6-14; Exodus 12:3-13; John 1:29 and 36; 1 Peter 1:18- 20; Revelation 5:5-13.

ARTICLE 4

GOSPEL OF SALVATION

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes. Romans 1:16. The Gospel is the good news that comes to believers by the death, burial resurrection and appearing of Jesus Christ.

SECTION ONE--NEW BIRTH

The gospel teaches that man must be born again. John 3:3-8. Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God. 1 John 5:1; 1 Peter 1:23; John 6:44, 65.

SECTION TWO--WATER BAPTISM

The believer in Jesus Christ may be baptized by being immersed in water in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Mark 16:16; Matthew 3:15; Acts 2:38, 10:48, 19:5, 22:16, thus fulfilling Matthew 28:19.

ARTICLE 5

THE CHURCH

The Church is that collective group of people from all nations, kindred and tongues that believe that Jesus is the Christ. The born again man/woman is a child of God and it is this group of born again believers that comprise the New Testament Church without regard to organization, denomination or creed. The only way to get into the New Testament Church is to be born of God and then Jesus adds you to the Church. No man can put you in or take you out of the Church. Acts 2:47.

SECTION ONE--THE BODY

The body of Christ was the Church and every believer was added to the body as the Spirit so willed. Romans 12:4-5; 1 Corinthians 6:15, 12:12-20, 12:27; Ephesians 5:30.

SECTION TWO--THE TEMPLE

The Christian is the temple of God, through which the Spirit ministers to mankind. Zechariah 6:12-13; 1 Corinthians 3:16-17, 6:19, 6:16; Ephesians 2:18-22.

SECTION THREE--THE CITY

The Church is Mount Zion, the city of the living God, the Holy City New Jerusalem, and the Church of the Firstborn. Hebrews 12:22-23; Revelation 21:2, 9-10, 22-27; Galatians 4:22-26; Zechariah 14:8-9; Isaiah 60:14, 62:12.

SECTION FOUR--THE NATION

The Church is the nation of God and has supplanted the Old Testament Israel. Matthew 21:43; Isaiah 65:1, 55:5; 1 Peter 2:9- 10; Romans 9:6-8, 11:26.

SECTION FIVE--THE KINGDOM

The Church is the Kingdom of God in which He rules supreme. Not a Kingdom of this world but among believers and in their hearts. Daniel 2:44, 4:3, 34, 7:9-14, 21-22, 26-27; Isaiah 9:6-7; Matthew 6:33, 21:43, 26:29; Mark 9:1; Luke 1:33, 7:28, 9:27, 12:32, 16:16, 17:21; John 18:36; Acts 8:12; Colossians 1:13; Hebrews 12:28; 2 Peter 1:11.

ARTICLE 6

THE KINGDOM OF GOD

The Kingdom of God is the results of that relationship between man and God and man and his fellowman. It is not meat and drink, it is not in word but in deed. It is righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. The Kingdom of God is not of this world and the believers are in the Kingdom of God. The unbelievers cannot enter into it or its benefits. Romans 13:17-18; Galatians 5:19-23; Revelation 21:27.

SECTION ONE-EVERLASTING KINGDOM

The Kingdom that "the Stone cut out of the mountain without hands", Daniel 2:44-45, established at His coming is an everlasting Kingdom. Daniel 2:44, 2 Peter 1:11; Daniel 7:13-14, 7:26-27; Luke 12:31-32, 9:27, 1:33.

SECTION TWO--HEALING

Another of the benefits of the Kingdom of God is the healing of our hearts (soul) and bodies by the power of God. Exodus 15:26;

Matthew 4:23-24; 8:16-17, 9:35; Mark 3:14-15, 16:15-20; Luke 10:9, 4:18, 9:1-2; Acts 10:38; James 5:13-16; 1 Peter 2:24.

SECTION THREE--TITHES AND OFFERINGS

Tithes and offerings have always been God's way of financing His work among men. A man of faith, Abraham, out of the appreciation of his heart unto God for the good that God had prospered him instituted it. Genesis 14:18-20. The man of faith today will for the same reasons, does likewise. Tithing was by faith with Abraham, the Law incorporated it in the Church of Moses. It is now the measure of the Christians appreciation and thankfulness unto God for giving him the natural blessings. Malachi 3:8-12; Matthew 23:23; Luke 6:38.

SECTION FOUR--GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT

God gives to His children many rich gifts. They are ours to use in His service to our fellowmen, and enjoy, in the Kingdom of God. He gave five gifts for the ministry. Ephesians 4:8-12. There are nine gifts of the Spirit given to the children of God. 1 Corinthians 12:1-11, 14:1.

ARTICLE 7

SECOND COMING OF JESUS

The first coming of Jesus brought salvation to men who believe. The Second Coming of Jesus was for Judgment of all men that had died. That there was a Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ is clearly taught in the word of God. Acts 1:11; Philippians 3:20; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Matthew 25:31-34.

SECTION ONE--THE RESURRECTION

The Bible teaches that all men shall stand before God and give account of their deeds. Not only the believers but also the unbelievers. Matthew 25:31-34; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; 1 Corinthians 15:12-58; Revelation 20:11-15.

SECTION TWO--FINAL JUDGMENT

That at the Second Coming of Jesus all men who had died were resurrected and judged is clearly taught in the Bible. Revelation 20:11-15; Matthew 25th chapter; Romans 14:10; Revelation 1:7.

THE CHURCH A DOCUMENT

For the Church to have a tax-exempt status with the Internal Revenue Service a simple organization is required. You may have as elaborate a set up as your need. The following example is sufficient for a small non-incorporated Church.

Pastor
Assistant Pastor
Secretary - Treasurer
(Or whatever you call your leaders.)

If a non-incorporated Church has property such as real estate you must have three other property trustees, This is what is required by the State of Texas so Check with your State Secretary for this requirement.

The Church must be a Certified Church. This means that the Church is issued a certificate certifying you by an authorized unit approved by the Internal Revenue Service such as the Gospel Ministerial Alliance. This certificate shows that you are an Established Church and a dependable, upright responsible unit and not a subversive, fly-by-night irresponsible tax dodging excuse.

You must apply to your nearest Internal Revenue Service office for an Employers Identification Number, even if you do not have paid employees. This identification number is the way the IRS knows you and where you are located. The EIN number must be on file with our office.

Apply to the Gospel Ministerial Alliance for a Membership Application as a Minister and if you want your Church certified, ask for a Church Membership Application. The Church must have a pastor who is a member of the GMA.

Memberships are renewable each year, January 1st. to January 1st. Failure to renew tells us that you are withdrawing membership and thus are not a certified Church and subject to the income tax.

A business meeting of the Church should be held each year or as often as is necessary and minutes of the meeting should be kept as a permanent record.

The latest requirement of the IRS is that you must issue an official receipt for every gift that will tax deducted. The IRS will honor this receipt when your donor makes income reports if you have a certification.
